


# Ferintosh Parish Church

The Kirk Session of Ferintosh Parish Church is pleased to announce that we plan to re-start services in the Church in Conon Bridge on a trial basis from

**Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> October 2020**

We would love for you to be there.

There will be two services each Sunday, the first at **11am** and the second at **12.15pm**. These services will run initially on a trial basis, in case the pandemic or weather cause further problems.

Sadly, seating will be limited due to Scottish Government guidelines, so anyone wishing to attend must contact the Session Clerk, Martin McLauchlan, by **Friday at 5pm** prior to the service to book a place.

Please note the following requirements for the safety of yourself and others while attending church:

- **Do not attend** church if you have **any** symptoms which could be related to Covid-19, or you are self-isolating.
- Always keep 2 metres from anyone who is not a member of your household before, during and after the service.
- Wear a face covering in church at all times unless you are exempt from doing so.
- Sanitise your hands on entering and leaving the church.
- Confirm your name and contact details with the door steward upon arrival at church for the purposes of NHS Scotland Test and Protect.
- Follow the advice of the stewards when entering, taking your seat and leaving church, and please do not move chairs around.
- Bibles, hymn books and orders of service will **not** be available in Church, so please bring your own if required, and do not share with others outside your household (singing will in any case not be possible during services)
- Children and young people (are more than welcome to attend the services, but unfortunately it will **not** be possible to provide crèche facilities, or organise Sunday Club or FYF on the premises at the present time.
- Unfortunately, to maintain reasonable ventilation throughout the church we are required to keep all doors open both before the service starts and during the service. Therefore, during the service, which will be 20 - 30 minutes in length, the church is likely to be **very cold** so you are strongly advised to put warm clothes on and “layer up”.
- Unfortunately, tea and biscuits will **not** be available after the service for the time being.

Please note, we plan to continue uploading a video of the service to the internet each Sunday, as well as the textual version, should you prefer to stay at home.

If you have any queries, please contact the Session Clerk and he will do his best to answer them.
